We are so glad you're here! We love having guests and we want to make sure your stay is as pleasant as possible. This notebook is designed to help you during your stay. You will find a listing of the cable and premium channels available plus other valuable information. In it, you will find an abundance of useful information.

We have enclosed some of our favorite local businesses to help you plan your itinerary. We also encourage you to check our www.caribbaconnect.com as a guide to all things St. Thomas! It's a great site with tons of information.

Each room has a private balcony and/or patio for your enjoyment. There is a seating area in front of the house that includes a dining table, six chairs, grill, as well as our favorite swinging egg chair, however the best views can be found from the pool deck. Enjoy the many deck chairs and pool floats we have available for your use.

Our house water system is provided in the "greenest" way possible: cool Caribbean rainwater is collected via cistern. We have a sediment filter, carbon filter and UV filter! We use the house water for bathing, showering, and brushing teeth. Drinking water can be found using the small silver spicket found near the kitchen sink, this can be used for making coffee, tea, etc. We're going green with our newly installed solar panels; however, electricity is very costly on the islands, and we ask that you turn off the Air Conditioning, and all lights, when you leave your room, or the house, especially at nights they attract bugs inside.

Whether you're here for family fun, high adventure, eco-friendly vacation, relaxation, or a romantic get-a-way, we hope you enjoy your stay! It does rain in paradise occasionally, so we've included a few games in the living room just in case. Please let us know how we can make your stay more enjoyable.

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Here are a few friendly reminders to keep in mind during your stay at Villa Marbella USVI

Check In – Check in time is 4:00pm unless other arrangements have been made in advance

Check out – Check out time is 10:00am unless other arrangements have been made in advance.

Water – Fresh tap water is always a premium on the island, so please use it wisely. Please feel free to enjoy the purified water provided for our guest using the drinking water faucet in the kitchen sink. You can find additional bottled water in the fridge.

Electricity – always in high demand here as well. Please be sure to turn off lights, A/C and appliances when no longer in use or upon leaving your suite.

Smoking/Vaping – smoking and/or vaping are not permitted in or around the property. If you are found smoking, or there is evidence of smoking (i.e, cigarette butts), you will be charged a \$250 fine.

Internet – Secure wireless internet is available. Please let us know if you are having trouble connecting. Wifi boosters are in the villa, so please do not unplug them.

In case of emergency – for fire, medical or other emergency call 911 first! Our physical address is 15-24 Frenchman's Bay. Fire extinguishers are located throughout the property.

Housekeeping – A full turnover is completed for a one week stay or longer. Additional cleaning available upon request for additional fee.

Parking – There is ample parking at the house. Please remember to drive on the LEFT on the entire island.

Currency – The currency on all US Virgin Islands is the US Dollar

Swimming Pool – There is no lifeguard on duty and all minors must be accompanied by an adult. Use of equipment is at your own risk.

Sunscreen – If you plan to visit any of the local beaches in St. Thomas, please be aware of the sunscreen law which bans the use of sunscreen containing oxybenzone, octinoxate, and octocrylene

Pharmacy – The Medicine Shoppe Pharmacy located in Havensight mall is a one-stop-shop for all your medical needs when on the island. Tip – this is also the only place we've found to purchase reading material on the island.

Maintenance – Our guests' safety is our utmost concern. Please let us know if you find anything in need of repair.

Points of Interest

- Historic Sites in Charlotte Amalie (Kongne's Quarter)
 - Charlotte Amalie beckons you to stroll along her cobble stone alleyways, climb her streets of steps, admire antique West Indian furnishings in historic homes and explore 17th century Danish fortifications. Founded in 1681 by Danish settlers, it contains a wealth of buildings that provide a glimpse into colonial life. It is listed in the National Registry of Historic Places as an area of historic interest. Often referred to as Downtown, or just Town, Charlotte Amalie today is a bustling center for government, schools, offices, shopping, and residences!
- Charlotte Amalie Harbor
 - St. Thomas' beautiful natural harbor welcomed the first settlers to the island and today it welcomes millions of visitors. Piers once dotted the waterfront area providing landing and loading space for trading ships. With time came change; donkey and horse drawn carts were replaced by automobiles. The waterfront



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area was filled in and a four-lane highway was built. The old warehouse with their piers jutting out into the harbor were landlocked. Today a stroll along the waterfront apron allows you to enjoy a terrific view of Charlotte Amalie; sailboats dotting the water, large cruise ships at the dock and seaplanes coming and going.

- Main Street
 - Main Street or Dronnigens Gade (Danish name meaning Queen's Street) is the main street running through Charlotte Amalie. The buildings on the south side of Main Street are long, separated by narrow alleys. These were warehouse for storing goods during the heyday of trade. On the north side are a collection of 18th and 19th century classic West Indian buildings and former town houses. The buildings are square in shape, and many are two stories with balconies. In the past the first floor housed shops; the second floor would have been the shop keeper's residence. Today many of these old buildings are repurposed as duty free shops.
- Fort Christian
 - Fort Christian, the oldest standing structure in the Virgin Islands, was designated a National Historical Landmark in 1977. The imposing fort with walls 3 to 6 feet thick was built between 1672 and 1680. It services as the administrative center of the island, the residence of the first Governor's and the official place of worship. Between 1724 and 1735 it was expanded and continued to function as government building. By the late 1800s the role shifted. The upper level of the fort served as the islands' prison from 1874-1983. Fort Christian Museum was established in 1971 in the downstairs area of the fort with exhibits of old photos, antique furniture, and artifacts.
- Emancipation Park and the Grand Galleria
 - This was named in commemoration of the July 3rd, 1848 emancipation of slaves in the Danish West Indies. On the west side of the park is a conch blower statue which also commemorates emancipation, and a reproduction of the Liberty Bell.
- The 99 steps
 - Charlotte Amalie is unique for step streets, or frigangs as the Danes called them. These steps were built in the mid 1700s. Dozens of step streets cut through nearly all the hills rising from the Charlotte Amalie harbor area; the 99 steps are the most popular. They are likely the most photographed as well; the picturesque stairway has colorful flowers on either side making it an easy choice for a photo.
- Three Queens Fountain
 - The Three Queens Fountain was unveiled in 2005 and commemorates three historically important women led a successful 1878 insurrection against the Danish Government demanding improved working and living conditions, and better wages. The demonstration is known as the "Fireburn". The women wear clothing typical of the mid-1800s, long dresses, with a long sleeved blouse and an apron. They carry in their hands: a lantern, a harvesting tool, and flambeaux (torch). The sculpture was made by American artist Richard Hallier.



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- Lutheran Church
 - The Lutheran Church is identifiable by its pretty yellow-gold color and its large 'welcoming arms' staircase. This initial congregation was founded in 1666 by Danish minister Kjeld Jensen who arrived on St. Thomas on an expedition to colonize the island. The first services were held in homes of planters and soldiers, and later in the confines of Fort Christian. The original sanctuary opened in 1793. It replaced two earlier buildings that were destroyed by fire. It was refurbished in 1826 and again in 1870. The church is still in use today. It is the oldest church on St. Thomas and the second oldest Lutheran Church building in the Western Hemisphere.
- St. Thomas Historical Trust Mini Museum
 - The St. Thomas Historical Trust's mission is to identify, protect, and preserve the historical identity, structures, sites, and cultural heritage of St. Thomas through education, advocacy and promotion. Their Mini-Museum has five rooms with antique furnishings, artifacts and old photos. Volunteer guides provide information on the items, and on island history. Open Monday to Friday, 10am-3pm. The entrance is through a gated alley; use the buzzer by the gate to ring the museum for entry. The Historical Trust hosts events like traditional broom making, furniture making and walking tours. Outside the Mini-Museum is Roosevelt Park renamed in 1945 in honor of a visit by President Franklin Delano Roosevelt.

Notable Beaches

- Abi Beach
 - Just a short hike from the house down the hill is one of the island's best kept secrets – private and secluded. Look for the two conch shells at the driveway for the start of the trail. This tranquil exclusive beach is only accessible by water to others. It's the perfect place for a morning walk or for enjoying some quiet fun in the sun!
- Hull Bay
 - This beach is known for its sunset beach walks. The restaurant, Hull Bay Hideaway, provides traditional American cuisine and refreshments throughout the day and evening. It takes quite a trek to get to this gem, but it is well worth it.
- Magens Bay
 - Popular with both locals and tourists alike, this heart-shaped wonder has miles of sand and sea to make for an enjoyable outline. It is great for kayaking, swimming, snorkeling, hiking, or jogging. The beach side snack bar has an excellent menu but if you get the urge to cook, grilling is allowed.
- Lindbergh Bay



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- o Just a few steps from the airport, this beach provides an unexpected charm and atmosphere. A favorite of both locals and visitors, Lindbergh Bay provides cool, crisp open waters and clean white sand. It is ideal for relaxing on the beach or playing in the ocean.
- Brewers Bay
 - o Brewers Bay is loved by locals living in St. Thomas' west end as it is ideal for swimming, fishing, beach games and relaxing. It is easy to get to and is near the University of the Virgin Islands' golf course, a heliport and the airport.
- Bolongo Bay
 - o On a clear day, guests of the Bolongo Bay Hotel can be seen frolicking in the ocean and relaxing on the sand. This beach plays host to Iggies Beach bar.
- Lindquist
 - o This beach is very close to St. Thomas' bustling east end but feels more like an escape from reality. It features about half a mile of uninterrupted beach and is a local favorite because of its serene beauty.
- Coki Point Beach
 - o Nestled deep in the heart of Smith Bay, Coki Point Beach is breathtaking. Perfect for snorkeling, relaxing in the sand or playing on the beach, the beach is lined with small huts providing local delights. It is a stone's throw from Coral World Marine Park
- Vessup
 - o This local favorite is hidden in St. Thomas' east end. The road to the beach is rugged but it is a peaceful getaway once you get there. Local boaters use the bay often.
- Sapphire Beach
 - o If you enjoy sports on the beach, this beach might be a great option for you. A flat area of sand makes it perfect for beach sports and many rentals are also available for fun in the open waters. Sapphire beach Hotel surrounds the beach.
- Secret Harbour Bay
 - o This little bay, located in front of the Secret Harbour Hotel, takes a bit of an effort to find, but its quaint charm and easy going atmosphere are well worth it.
